I, \_\_\_\_\_ RANDY PARKER \_\_\_\_\_, WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

On 10 September 2010, I bought a Samsung brand CB radio from Best Buy in Richmond Hill, Georgia and had it installed under the dash of my 2002 Ford F150. I also bought a clip-on, portable antenna to use with the radio. There have been car burglaries around the barracks ever since I arrived here and I wanted to have a removable antenna so that no one would know there was a CB radio inside the truck when it was parked. It was my practice to remove the antenna and store it under the seat when the vehicle was parked.

On 20 September, at about 2000, I left the barracks and drove to the Officers NCO Club on Hero Road. While I was driving, I used my CB radio and monitored radio traffic until I arrived at the club. I parked directly in front of the club in a well-lit area and removed the CB antenna and stowed it under the passenger seat. The CB radio itself is not visible from outside the truck because it's mounted under the dash and recessed a few inches. I went into the club and had a few beers and played some pool and left at 2345. As I walked out the front door of the club and toward the parking lot, I saw my truck. As I got closer I noticed broken glass below the passenger side window and then that the window was broken and the door was slightly open. My first thought was that my CB had been stolen and when I looked, I found that both the antenna and the CB were missing. The wires to the back of the CB had been cut. I looked around to see if there were any witnesses but there was no one around that I could see. I went back inside the club and asked the Club Manager if anyone had reported seeing my vehicle damaged. I also asked several people who I did not know if they had noticed anything but no one had. The Club Manager then called the military police and they arrived less than 5 minutes later. After examining the truck and making notes, they brought me here to the MP station to make this statement.

Q: Were you alone when you went to the NCO Club on 20 September?

A: Yes, I was alone. I left the barracks alone, did not pick up anyone on the way, and arrived at the club alone. Although I spoke to a few acquaintances in the club, none of them went outside or anywhere near my vehicle that I know of.

Q: Did you disturb the crime scene when you returned to your car and discovered it had been broken into?

A: The only thing I disturbed was the door when I opened it and the glove compartment door when I opened it to see if my personal papers were still there.

Q: Describe the radio that was stolen from your vehicle on 20 Sep 10.

A: It's a Samsung 40 channel Citizens Band Radio with a black plastic face and the words, Samsung 40 CH printed in white letters on the front. It was about 9 inches wide, 2 inches tall, and 8 inches deep and weighed about 2 pounds. The antenna was about 40 inches long and had a round, black plastic base.

Q: Do you know of anyone who might have wanted to steal your radio or suspect anyone?

A: Well, lots of people admitted it but I don't know anyone who would actually break into my car to steal it.

Q: Is there any other information that you can provide that would aid this investigation?

A: No, nothing else I can think of. I will call you at DSN 767-1234 if I find any other information. //End of Statement//
